# May 2007 Elections

Local council elections are due to be held in May 2007, when all existing members of the Town Council will need to decide whether to seek re-election.

Do you think <u>you</u> would make a good Councillor? Why not find out how you can help <u>your</u> community? Any present councillor would be happy to tell you what is involved. This is your opportunity to be part of local democracy.

#### **Accounts**

The audit on the Town Council's accounts for 2005/6 has now been completed.

Anyone wishing to inspect the accounts may do so by making an appointment by telephoning the Town Clerk on 01278 788088.

The audit of the 2006/7 accounts will take place towards the end of 2007.

# **Budget for 2007/8**

After careful consideration of its budget for 2007/8, members of the Town Council this year agreed to a net budget of £293,486 for 2006/7, of which a net figure of £127,906 is the Town Council's contribution towards the expenditure incurred for the Burnham Joint Burial Committee. By careful management of its reserves and prudent management of the budgetary requirements for the coming year, the Town Council has been able to keep its precept requirement (ie the figure the local taxpayer has to bear) to a total of £279,486 (including the budget for the Burial Committee) which equates to £41.65 pence per household per annum for an average band D property, an increase of just £1.39 or 3.45% for the year.

**Planning:** The Town Council has been pressing Sedgemoor District Council for a review of the overall strategy for Highbridge in terms of planning as members are concerned about the volume of new housing development without any improvements to the infrastructure (leisure facilities, schools, doctors' surgery, transport).

A new consultation document on the appraisal of the conservation area boundaries in Burnham on Sea has been issued by Sedgemoor District Council, with a deadline for responses of 12 noon on Wednesday 7 March. A copy of the document may be inspected at the Town Council offices in Jaycroft Road.

**The Princess:** Discussions continue on the way forward for the future management of the Princess. Members of the Town Council have visited the building and are currently looking at ways of improving facilities there, and formal negotiations continue with Sedgemoor District Council as to the terms and conditions to be attached to the acquisition of the building.

**Burnham Joint Burial Committee** is made up of representatives from Burnham and Highbridge Town Council and Burnham Without Parish Council. It is responsible for the management of three cemeteries—Highbridge, Burnham on Sea (Westfield Road) and the new cemetery at Brent Road, Berrow, which will eventually serve all the residents of Burnham and Highbridge and residents from Burnham Without Parish once the cemeteries in Burnham and Highbridge are full.

At Brent Road, we have recently introduced a new Rose Garden where ashes can be interred and marked by a commemorative stone.
